LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

Dear Boys & Girls Club Supporter:

Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Houston (BGCGH) is in a growth and expansion mode, as reflected in the first two quarters of 2023.

More than 50,000 youth are projected to come through our doors this year, which tracks with our numbers for the first half of the year. This means we have 50,000 opportunities to impact lives and set the course for success in school and in life.

To address growth, we are adding Clubs. Construction continues on our fifth Fort Bend County Club in Rosenberg, a state-of-the-art facility. In February, we held the grand opening of our Cristo Rey Jesuit College Preparatory School Club in Southeast Houston. We recently celebrated the opening of the Barbara Bush Children's Library at our Spring Branch Boys & Girls Club, which supports our pillar of academic readiness.

We continue to provide robust, innovative programming to address the needs of our Club members, including mitigation of pandemic and summer learning loss through targeted STEAM, reading, and enrichment activities.

In Q1 and Q2, we expanded our board of directors with the election of seven new members, representing the public and private sectors, including health care, communications, education, energy, oil & gas, and banking. These five women and two men reflect the community we live in and share a commitment to ensuring that all members have the tools they need to be life and workforce ready.

February's Youth of the Year Dinner celebrated the most outstanding of our Club members, with Ky'Saan Piatti of the Houston Texans Teen Club being named 2023 Youth of the Year. In April, we honored the Houston Texans Foundation, with chairs Hannah and Cal McNair, at our Great Futures Dinner, raising nearly \$1 million. And again this year, we hosted the national Juneteenth webinar at the historic Reedy Chapel in Galveston, Texas.

Finally, at the yearly Boys & Girls Clubs of America national conference in Orlando, BGCGH was recognized by Boys & Girls Clubs of America with three distinguished awards: The Workforce Readiness Award, Youth Megaphone Award, and The Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Award.

The first half of 2023 has been busy and fruitful. We thank you for your continued support of our efforts.

2023 Julius Young Youth of the Year

Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Houston (BGCGH) is proud to announce that Ky'Saan Piatti, a member of the Houston Texans Teen Club, was named BGCGH's 2023 Julius Young Youth of the Year during the annual Youth of the Year dinner held February 17 at the Junior League of Houston. Sheriff Ed Gonzalez of the Harris County Sheriff's Office, served as keynote speaker, while emcee duties were handled by Deepi Sidhu, Texans Insider and Lead Writer with the Houston Texans.



The Youth of the Year program honors and celebrates inspiring teens and their incredible journeys and is based on outstanding leadership, service, academic excellence, and dedication to living a healthy lifestyle. The program and event were generously underwritten by Chevron.

Ky'Saan will receive a \$10,000 college scholarship from the Julius Young Youth of the Year Scholarship Fund and a \$5,000 college scholarship from Chevron which he plans to use at Wichita State University upon graduation.



When asked about his philosophy, Ky'Saan replied, "Be kind to others, never judge a book by its cover, and the most important of them all, always be true to yourself."

More than 200 attendees, including BGCGH board members, staff and supporters, also got to hear from BGCGH's two other top Youth of the Year candidates: Jadyne Perez from the Houston Texans Teen Club and a sophomore at Heights High School, and Jonathan Salazar from the Richmond-Rosenberg Boys & Girls Club and a junior at B.F. Terry High School. Each gave inspiring speeches about their personal journeys with Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Houston and received scholarships as well.



In order to choose one youth to represent BGCGH at the state competition, judges were recruited to hear from all the Youth of the Year candidates and had the tough job of narrowing it down to only one. The Spring Branch Club began the year at a -0.67 gap in reading level. In the first quarter, the youth were able to close that gap, putting them on grade level with national peers. Reading proficiency is essential because it correlates with future success and high school graduation.
